1. H&I question by Mark S: Mark discussed adding to the guidelines questions about medications that the applicants may currently be taking. Laura responded that it may be a slippery slope and that it may have a lot to do with sponsorship. Many pros and cons were discussed. Mark was directed to ask the facility if they have any regulations regarding medications and volunteers and bring back to the area.

2. Just for Today group is not active at this time since it's the second meeting without a report and no other action is necessary.

Stephen said PR efforts by ASC were possible and selling shirts can be challenging and maybe best to just ask the group for more money in the basket. Porter wondered if it was ok for the group to provide shirts. Rick thought the group should make fliers. The C&S group knows a company that would be interested in doing the shirts and the group would most likely move forward if the body thought it was a good idea. Kerry said sometimes fundraisers don't make that much money and also to have a release for the logo so an addict doesn't want the profits from their art work. Krissy said the money would be used for literature. Mark said sometimes groups can disagree over extra money, and Laura asked about FIPT. The groups can use NA logos as long as they include the registered trademark, but individuals do not have the rights to use them.

Hello everyone, glad to be here and of service. I attended the last Regional Meeting in Sheridan on October 1, 2011, where we spent the morning workshopping the "Literature Distribution and Fund Flow in a New Service System" and "Zones for Third Draft Service System Proposals".

The Delegate brought information on using Wells Fargo for the Regional checking account and we discussed that at length during the meeting. He also reported on going to the Zonal Forum and stated the next Zonal Forum will be in Idaho Falls on December 3, 2011, where there will a member from the World Board or a staff worker to workshop the Conference Agenda Report.

The Alternate Delegate gave a reminder that Living Clean: The Journey Continues approval draft is out and available online at [http://www.na.org/?ID=Living\\_Clean\\_Project](http://www.na.org/?ID=Living_Clean_Project). It is also available for purchase for \$8.95. This is literature that will be in the Conference Agenda Report 2012 for approval. Copies of this has been passed out for review and she hopes that addicts have taken the time to read it. Also, she brought up the new Service IP (Social Media) and reminded us that review and input on this new piece of literature is due by October 31, 2011 and if you have reviewed it and have any input to let Tommy or her know and they will get it submitted..

The Web Servant wants us to keep him informed of any changes to the meeting lists so he can have the website current for any addict needing meetings can go to a valid meeting.

Convention Chair XII reported they were able to turn over \$1311.85 to the region.

Convention Chair XIII gave a lengthy report. Bud quit as Vice Chair. Inquiring with the bank about online banking. Budgets mostly covered at the last meeting. They are looking at having a hot pool available for the convention for conventioners. They are having a fundraiser October 22, 2011 in Powell.

Central Basin: Carla said they are growing and striving to support their groups. Campout went well. Had elections at the last meeting and all positions are filled, and gave a rather detailed reported on their meetings.

Central Wyoming: Ryan showed up and gave a verbal report. Had a donation to the Region and had some ideas to discuss on cutting costs at Region level.

Freedom Seekers: Spider reported that he is the RCM for them and that they are not doing so well at the present time. The Gillette Group GSR has not been to an Area Business meeting for the last 4 months and has not heard from them. The New Freedom Group is not doing so well as Committee members are missing meetings and has limited money on hand.

Wyo-braska: JR had no written report and gave a verbal report. They have a new Web Servant, and are having a Harvest gathering Halloween in Cheyenne, details to follow.

Wyoming Western: I reported meetings are going strong in Rock Springs, Green River & Evanston with Lyman, Kemmerer & Pinedale needing support and that Kemmerer & Pinedale are now part of our quorum. I reported on the Uinta County Detention Center meeting in Evanston. I reported on the LPG campout and what positions we currently have open.

After our Serenity Break we had a Sharing Session on what the Region can do to support the Freedom Seekers Area. Spider commented that it's hard/difficult to keep people involved and made a commitment to making the Regional Meetings on a regular basis. We discussed possibly merging two ASC's until the 2<sup>nd</sup> one can support itself.

Old Business: We discussed Travel funding and ideas to help the Region with funding our Trusted Servants to the Regional meetings throughout the year. We also discussed the possibility of changing the Regional Bank Account from who we currently have it to Wells Fargo. Our guidelines should be updated and Tommy will get them e-mailed out. It was discussed about the Delegate getting with the RCM to set the location of the Regional meeting to be held in that Area. When it came to elections, Vice Chair, Treasurer & Secretary positions are open, we tabled elections til the next Regional Meeting.

The next Regional Meeting will be held in Casper on February 4, 2012 and will be going over the Conference Agenda Report starting at 9 am at 500 S. Wolcott.
